## US launches alpaca promotion company

A new company has been launched in the US to boost the competitiveness of alpaca. Established by alpaca farmers and processors in North America and led by Nicholas Hahn, former CEO and president of Cotton Incorporated, Alpaca United will create and manage market-building campaigns designed to increase alpaca's market share, product demand and pricing.

Hahn, CEO of the new company, said that its mission is to "develop a brand identity for alpaca fibre as the softest, warmest, lightest textile fibre on earth combined with flame resistance and hypoallergenic performance."

He said that the initial plan is to add value through a brand identity programme targeting the luxury end of the textile and apparel markets. Alpaca United is headquartered in Old Lyme, Connecticut, located on the shore of Long Island Sound close to New York City.

**AUSTRALIA:** The Wool Exchange's Eastern Market Indicator (EMI) closed today at 1,325 Australian cents/kg clean, down 27 cents/kg clean (2%) on the last sale held on April 14.

However, since January the EMI has risen by 28.5% and 50.2% since the start of the season.

In US dollars, the market fell by 19 cents (1.3%) to 1,403 US dollars/kg cents, with the Australian dollar rising slightly from 105.2 US cents last week to 105.9 US cents yesterday. Analysts have noted the high exchange rate is putting pressure on the market, particularly in China.

## Royal wedding Merino suit finished

A suit made from wool donated by over 200 Australian woolgrowers to celebrate the union of Prince William and Kate Middleton has been finished in anticipation of Britain's royal wedding on April 29. Prince William is in line to be head of state of several Commonwealth countries including Australia. The cloth is made of fibres sent from woolgrowing properties representing every Australian state.

From Sydney, the donated wool was scoured and combed in Biella, Italy by Pettinatura di Verrone, before being dyed and spun at Bulmer & Lumb in Bradford. The cloth was then woven by Taylor & Lodge in Huddersfield, UK, before being tailored into a suit by Anderson & Sheppard in Saville Row.

Edward Waterhouse, marketing director of Taylor & Lodge, said: "For hundreds of years Taylor & Lodge has worked on fine woven wool cloths. It gives our staff great satisfaction to have

helped the Australian woolgrowers make a gift fit for the Prince and to contribute to this invaluable service."

As one of the charities nominated by Prince William to benefit from a gift fund established for the royal wedding, the Royal Flying Doctor Service of Australia (RFDS) will be the beneficiary of the private sale of the surplus Australian Merino wool suit lengths.

Australian Wool Innovation (AWI) CEO, Stuart McCullough, said: "The project to dress Prince William in the lead-up to his wedding was initiated by woolgrowers as a gesture of thanks to his father, HRH the Prince of Wales as his global campaign continues to raise the awareness of wool as a natural and renewable fibre."

A small sample of the final cloth will be sent to every Australian woolgrower who contributed to the bale.

In euros, the market fell by 8 cents (0.8%) to 974. This week's offering of 48,837 bales brought a clearance of 84%, with 873 bales withdrawn. The high pass in rate, which reached 20.6% on Wednesday, has been attributed to the poorer quality offering.

Buyers for China continued to dominate, although some prominent companies were less active, waiting until after the Easter recess to fulfil May orders. Competition came from Europe, India and Taiwan.

Based on last week's sales, analysts expected the market to fall, arguing that a correction was necessary to check the season's rising prices, particularly in US terms. This easing is also attributed to caution from buyers waiting to see how the market will react when sales resume in May.

Prices for fine fleece wools eased by an average of 2%. Quality remained low in the east, with large amounts of rain producing cotted, discoloured and

tender wools. As a result, in Fremantle the pass in rate reached 20.6%.

On Tuesday in Melbourne, the Micron Price Guide (MPG) for 17 micron fleece wools fell by 66 cents, with 17.5 microns closing 55 cents cheaper. In Fremantle, prices for 18-19 micron fleece wools fell by 54 cents on average. Decreases of 20-30 cents were common in Sydney on Tuesday, with prices for lower quality styles falling by up to 60 cents.

Sales on Wednesday followed suit. In Melbourne, 17 and 18 micron fleece wools closed 28 cents and 33 cents easier respectively. However, since the start of the season prices for 17 micron fleece wools have risen by 92.5%, with 18 micron types up 74.6%.

Medium fleece wools in the 19.5-22 micron range were least affected. In Fremantle on Tuesday, 21-22 micron fleece wools eased by 5-10 cents, with 23 micron types down 20 cents. In Melbourne yesterday, prices for 21 micron and coarser lots fell by 10-15 cents.

The pass in rate for skirtings

reached 20%, with lots containing colour and cots heavily discounted in Sydney on Tuesday. Pieces closed up to 10 cents easier in Fremantle. Yesterday, skirtings continued to retreat in Melbourne by 20 cents.

Demand was low for the small selection of low style crossbreds in Sydney on Tuesday, which closed 15-30 cents cheaper. In Melbourne, 27-30 microns crossbreds fell by 20 cents, as the finer end retreated a further 20 cents yesterday.

Following the easing of this week's market, cardings lost 20-25 cents in the price of locks, with stains falling 10 cents in Sydney on Tuesday. Locks eased by up to 15 cents for carbo types in Fremantle yesterday, with locks also closing 10-15 cents lower in Melbourne.

The sales will resume on May 2, with an estimated 48,950 bales on offer nationally. Experts anticipate there could be an effect on the market as sales begin to wind down in South Africa, which is in recess until May 3.

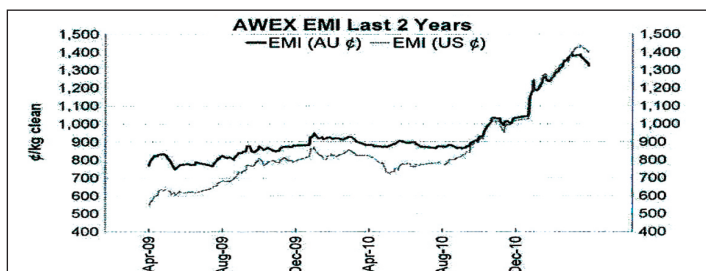
